What became of the claim?

Material Damage



During project preparation, a building company was gathering the necessary equipment at their storage premises for an upcoming job. A grinder machine fell from a forklift due to being improperly secured. The machine, valued at \$10,000, sustained considerable damage and was rendered inoperable. As a critical piece of equipment, the grinder was essential to daily operations.

Impact

The damage posed an immediate threat of business interruption. The grinder's loss would have significantly delayed the upcoming construction project, impacting the company's ability to meet deadlines and maintain service continuity as they would be unable to start work.

Response

The claim was reported within 24 hours of the incident. Delta appointed a loss adjuster on the same day, who promptly conducted an on-site assessment. Recognising the urgency, the adjuster recommended a cash settlement over sourcing a replacement, allowing the insured to leverage their industry contacts for faster procurement.

Outcome

After consultation with their broker, the insured accepted the recommended cash settlement of \$10,000. This swift resolution allowed the company to resume full operations the following day – minimising downtime and preventing any significant business interruption.
